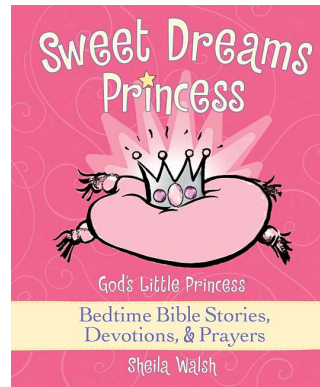

At first glance, you'll notice that this book is geared towards young girls between ages 4 & 8. Your girls will like the jeweled crown and puffy pink pillow on the cover and the many colorful illustrations throughout. This book has 81 different stories from both the Old and New Testaments based on the International Children's Bible. After each Bible story there is a sweet dreams devotion and either a prayer, promise, or praise. It's the sweet dreams devotions that give this book an A+ in my book. That's where you'll find further explanation to each Bible story and some simple questions that can lead to a great discussion.
